## **RESIDENT/PROPERTY OWNER CONCERNS:**

- There was discussion regarding concern of dilapidated property at 515 West Broad Street, where adolescents were seen "hanging out." PA State Police were contacted and arrived at the property to address the situation. Further action was taken by Williams Township to contact the property owner by letter, dated November 4, 2022, describing the situation, and requested approval to place "No Trespassing" signs at the property. Awaiting response from property owner. Future action will be to contact Light-Heigel & Associates, Inc., to evaluate the property.
- There was discussion regarding the status of property at 523 Greenfield Street. The Township contacted Light-Heigel & Associates, Inc., who examined the property and determined it to be hazardous and to stop further construction. No further action is necessary.

## **BUSINESS DISCUSSED:**

- The draft Budget for 2023 was reviewed. Ron Paul expressed gratitude to Jack Schaeffer for his assistance and revising the format.
