

MINUTES

April 1, 2019

Board met in regular session with Thomas Shuttlesworth, Ronald Paul and Harold Smith in attendance. Minutes of previous meeting and treasurer report were approved as submitted. Also in attendance were Larry Hoke, James Drum, Patty Nye, Linda Lewis, Penny Bush, Greer Aukstakalnis, and Attorney Joseph Kerwin.

Patty Nye reported on the progress of the "Hometown Banners" with approximately 224 sold. She asked is the township could provide safety signs/cones when they begin installation.
